- 24/7 access to health and human services.
- Critical to disaster and crises and recovery.



What can I call 2-1-1 for?

- Non-Profit Agencies
- Governmental Agencies
- Self-Help Support Groups
- Community and Civic Organizations
- Hospitals, Clinics, Care Homes
- Child or Adult Day Care
- Mental health and/or substance abuse treatment services.
- To donate goods
- Prenatal, pediatric, maternal, and/or postpartum health care.
- Suicide Intervention
- Crisis Counseling
- Pregnancy/Parenting Support Agencies
- Utility Assistance
- Agencies that provide services for infants and children with special needs.
- Food Pantry
- Educational testing, or counseling services for Family Planning, HIV/AIDS, STDs, or TB.
